# KNIVETON PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting of Kniveton Parish Council took place on Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> February 2015 and the following items were discussed:-

*Parish Field* – Cllr Bradbury reported that the hedges had been trimmed.

*Broadband Provision* – Whilst many areas now have a good standard of broadband provision, the villages around Carsington are still waiting for upgrade. Cllr Ratcliffe informed the meeting that this area was proving to be difficult but that progress is being made.

*Dog Fouling* – The two play areas on the Parish Field have been submitted for inclusion in a DCC Public Space Protection Order which goes to Committee towards the end of February and to full Council towards the end of March.

*Highways* – A pothole and a noisy manhole cover on the Hillocks has been reported and Cllr Ratcliffe will follow this up. Cllr Ratcliffe also informed the meeting that re-surfacing the carriageway at Hillocks is on the programme.

***Winter Weather Precautions*** – Traffic in, out and through the village was largely kept moving during the recent heavy snowfall due to the good offices of Derbyshire County Council Highways, Mr Hammersley from Offcote and David Bott who admirably kept Pethills/Foxholes clear – many thanks on behalf of the Parish Council. Some discussion took place re the siting of the grit bin to cover the main road/Longrose Lane junction. Councillors to consider alternative site for next meeting/next winter. Also reported, a blocked drain outside Close Farm.

***Footpaths*** – Residents are encouraged to report any minor maintenance requirements on local footpaths to either a parish councillor or the clerk. The Parish Council has an annual allocation of funds from Derbyshire County Council and whilst the sum is modest, councillors are anxious that it should be expended on improving and maintaining local paths.

***Parish Council Elections*** – These will take place in conjunction with local arrangements for the General Election on Thursday 7<sup>th</sup> May 2015

***Finance*** – Payments and balances to 10<sup>th</sup> February were presented and approved by the meeting.

The Parish Council resolved that a standstill parish precept be maintained for the financial year 2015/2016. A figure of £4295.00 is submitted to DDDC which represents a charge of £26.17 per average Band D property.
