peaceful days!





KNIVETON PARISH COUNCIL

The meeting of Kniveton Parish Council took place on Tuesday 15th July 2014 and the following items were discussed:-

Neighbourhood Watch – Thanks recorded to Sarah Mead and Cllr Bradbury for overseeing acquisition and placing of new signage.

Telephone Box – Following request by Parish Council, BT repainted the telephone box at the junction of Foxholes Lane/B5035.

Newspaper Box – Thanks recorded to J Young Engineering Services Ltd for supplying and painting the new newspaper box. Unfortunately, the excellent finish was slightly damaged by BT personnel during their painting of the telephone box.

Newhouse Farm – The situation continues to be monitored by DCC Planning.

Financial Regulations – A set of draft, model financial regulations were adopted by Kniveton Parish Council.

Dog Fouling – The Parish Council was disappointed to hear that dog fouling by a minority of dog owners continues to be a problem in the village. In the interests of health, hygiene and good citizenship, councillors would urge and encourage the few who do not deal responsibly with their pet's excrement to act responsibly in this matter. New signage will shortly appear in the village.

Highways – Councillors recorded their thanks to DCC Cllr Irene Ratcliffe for her efforts in getting the pot holes filled on Pethills Lane. Whilst as yet, no progress has been made on the issue of signage to discourage HGVs from using this route, Cllr Ratcliffe is gathering support from neighbouring parishes. Further reports; pot holes at the junction of Kingshead Lane/B5035, a noisy manhole cover opposite the church gates, overgrown grass verges on Longrose Lane, potholes from Damson Cottage to Kniveton Carr, all to be passed on the DCC Highways for action.

Footpaths – Derbyshire Wildlife Trust visited Washpool Lane and was of the opinion that it was a habitat worth keeping. Action to prevent backing up of water to be undertaken later in the year. Maintenance work to be carried out on top end of St James' Lane.

Finance – Accounts for year ending 31st March 2014 audited by Grant Thornton and found to be in order. A summary is posted on the Parish Council notice board.


