All 3 men brought in the balls they had goaled previously (from 1969 onwards) & passed these round for the children to look at as well as giving a short slideshow about Shrovetide and explaining how the balls are made. The children asked lots of questions and teacher Sue Cartlidge thanked the three men for their talk.







Teeth


Inside a tooth Inside a tooth there are 4 things called enamel, pulp, dentin and root canal.



Canine


How to clean your teeth:








KNIVETON PARISH COUNCIL MEETING

The Council met on the 29th March. From the outset the Council were involved in extended discussions. The opening discussion was on a matter not included on the agenda but was considered a matter of general interest and importance. The subject was the parking at and around the school during the delivery and collection of children. It was considered that some parents were not parking considerately or using common sense. There were numerous instances of cars being illegally parked on the pavements and at the bus stop. The police Officer in attendance at the meeting duly noted the comments and remarked that similar situations existed at other schools in the area. It was confirmed that the provision of yellow lines etc in the vicinity of the school are due to be completed in the very near future and hopefully will solve the problems.

Traffic calming measures were discussed and the meeting was informed that many villages are setting up "Community Speed Watch". This is where a volunteer from the village is provided with a Speed Camera to check for vehicles exceeding the speed limit entering the village. The volunteer will be accompanied by a Police Officer. Drivers caught speeding will receive a written warning. Further action could be taken against repeat offenders. Volunteers are required and persons interested should contact their local Councillor.

A Maintenance agreement for the village playing field has been agreed involving the School and the Parish Council. A small annual fund has been set up with contributions from both parties to cover the cost of maintenance. Copies of the agreement will be published in the near future specifying all the details.

On May 5th there will be a District and Parish Council Elections held in the Village Hall. Any person considering to seek election as a councillor needs to obtain a Nomination Form from "The Returning Officer" D.D.D.C. Town Hall, Matlock, DE4 3NN" Completed Nomination Forms have to be returned by the 4th April

It was stated that the vast majority of holes in the roads had been repaired. It was agreed that Foxholes Lane is still in need of attention.

The next Council meeting will be held on the 31st May.
