

#### KNIVETON PARISH COUNCIL

#### CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2016-17

This year has been extremely busy year with events and developments in our village. Once again, many social activities have bought people together throughout the year.

#### Fond Farewells and Welcomes

Kniveton bid a fond farewell to Parish Clerk Mike Severn who was a great asset to the village over the last fourteen years. The Parish Council wished him well in his retirement and welcomed a new Parish Clerk, Kath Gruber.

After 16 years Mary, our Kniveton News editor, has hung up her pen and handed over to Hannah Barton and Kev Woolley. The Parish Council wish Mary the very best and thank her for her time, energy and enthusiasm. We welcome Hannah and Kev and look forward to working with you.

#### Road Safety

The year began with discussions about how to best address road safety issues on the B5035 through Kniveton. As a result of feedback from local residents, a comprehensive list of possible measures has been raised for consideration by Derbyshire County Council and the Parish Council.

When all the appropriate measures have been put in place and there has been time for their effectiveness in reducing speed to be assessed, the situation with the lines and cats' eyes will be reviewed, so do keep your comments coming in to any parish councillor.

The Ashbourne Safer Neighbourhood police-led scheme agreed to make the reduction of traffic speed in Kniveton a priority. A Community Speedwatch scheme has been set up with village residents and the Police Community Support Officer resulting in drivers whose speed exceeds the limit being sent warning letters.

The 20mph school safety zone is now in place. We are still discussing more effective rumble strips with the county council.

#### Defibrillator

The Parish Council has purchased a defibrillator which will be positioned outside the village hall. Training for residents and our school staff in using a defibrillator has been organised.

#### Grants

The Parish Council supported local activities and initiatives throughout the year awarding grants to the Kniveton Newsletter, the Get Together Club and Churchyard mowing.

#### Keeping Our Village Beautiful

During this year the number of complaints the Parish Council received regarding dog fouling around the village has increased. New signs have been put up asking people to pick up after their dogs.

#### New Village Signage

Larger more welcoming signs have been purchased through generous donations and will be installed when Derbyshire County Council is able to do the work

I was delighted to be presented with the original painting that inspired the signs by the artist at the Parish Council meeting in March and have arranged that this will be displayed in the church.

#### Faster Broadband

The Parish Council has been talking with Digital Derbyshire and Kniveton is included in Digital Derbyshire's second phase of work (2018). In the interim residents can access a broadband service with at least 2Mbps download through central Government's voucher scheme which enables you to redeem (up to £350) with independent suppliers of either wireless or satellite. The voucher covers hardware, installation, commissioning and activation – not the ongoing monthly costs. #### MAY MEETING

Following the AGM the Parish Council meeting discussed the following agenda items:

#### Defibrillator – the following was agreed:

- I. Councillor Bradbury to arrange the installation of the AED in the unlockable cabinet purchased
- 2. To seek advice on security measures from the local PSCO.
- 3. A sign will be placed on the AED making it clear the machine SAVES LIVES to discourage criminal interference.
- 4. Additional training sessions for residents to be arranged
- 5. Over the next few months guidance on using AED to be placed in Village Noticeboard, on the Council website and Facebook page.

#### Parish Field

The Council are to seek advice on alternative flooring options beneath the play apparatus to prevent continued damage to the matting.

#### **Bus Shelter**

Broken window in Bus Shelter opposite the village hall – after the bird nesting season this will be bricked up.

Kniveton Parish Council is made up of six councillors and meets bi-monthly in Kniveton Village Hall. Members of the public are welcome to attend and participate.

The Parish Council is administered by a parish clerk/responsible financial officer. Also attending meetings in an official capacity is a DCC Councillor, a DDDC Councillor and representation from the local police force.

#### Highfields Footpath

DCC have investigated the overgrowth and following the bird nesting season will review it again and instruct appropriate action to ensure it is accessible.

#### Finance

Payments and balances were presented and approved. The annual audit finalised by the Clerk and Internal Auditor was approved and will be submitted to the External Auditors (Grant Thornton).



#### **OBITUARY: JILL CHARLESWORTH**

Jill was the eldest child of Thomas and Eileen Bradley. Born in 1945 at home in Stubwood, she was followed over time by Wendy, Sandra, Carole and Andrew.

She went to Denstone Primary school before going on to Uttoxeter Girls' High School. After leaving school she worked for an Accountant in Uttoxeter, then moved to the Post Office there

It was during this time she met Roy at a Young Farmers' Dance, dancing ensured and life took her in a new direction. They married in October 1968 and in December 1972 moved here to Kniveton, bringing up their 3 children, Diane, David and Karen on the farm. Over time, the family expanded to include sons-in-law David and Ashley and grandchildren Matthew and Katy. She was very proud of her children and grandchildren.

From the start, Jill played an active, supporting role on the farm which continued until recently, rising early to feed the calves and taking Roy and David a cup of tea as they were milking. She was also active in the community, helping with the church flowers, the Harvest supper and the whist drives. She was a member of the WI, serving as treasurer, programme organiser, secretary and latterly cookery guru. At 71 she was still baking mince pies and helping to deliver them to the "elderly "in the village. Jill was one of those people, who just got on with things in the background, quietly, unassumingly.

She liked to keep busy – she loved baking; her family mentioned her coffee cake, the WI

remember her lemon drizzle cake. She liked to grow things – her sisters talk about going to her for rhubarb, plums, damsons and raspberries. She was creative, making wedding and bridesmaids dresses for family, knitting for people, and attending needlework courses. Sadly her creativity didn't extend to electrical work – she once burnt a hole in Roy's penknife trying to fix the hoover (she forget to unplug it first) and she often managed to cut through the wires when mowing the lawn.

She loved being outside – perhaps a result of walks she and her siblings and cousins would take with their grandad – a love she shared with her children, who remember family picnics at Dovedale and Tissington splash, and with her grandchildren in their walks down to the brook

Jill liked to share what she grew and made – the WI made robins last Christmas and she got a second kit so she could make one with Katy; I have her rhubarb in my garden, she made our WI president a cake for her 70th birthday. She made and kept many friends from primary schooldays onwards. She was kind and she was caring

She hardly ever had a holiday but it didn't bother her - she was happy with her lot in life – caring for family, serving in her community and showing her interest in people by helping where she could, whenever she could. She will be greatly missed.

Jill Charlesworth passed away on 21st March 2017.

#### UPDATE ON RESOLVING THE B5035 SPEEDING ISSUES

#### Speeding incidents

As requested by the parish council, another flow meter speed check has been carried out. When the results have been analysed, we will know if the various measures which have been introduced have been effective, or if more needs to be done. In particular, we hope to be able to tell if the removal of the white lines and cats' eyes has had the desired effect. The parish council will then decide if it is sensible to ask for their re-instatement. Any views which residents have on this will continue to be very welcome.

#### Village signs

These are now installed and look great. We hope that they contribute to the perception of entering a village where a fast speed is not appropriate.

#### 20mph school safety zone

This is now in place and working well.

#### Interactive speed signs

(signs which tell drivers the speed at which they are travelling)

The parish council will review the need for these when it has the results of the flow meter speed check. It is possible that the attitude of the county council will change.

As usual, do report any speeding issues and ideas for resolving them to any member of the parish council.

A few days ago we had an email at Kniveton News (see left) which left me intrigued....

I had heard of William (Bill) Beard as my grandfather, Bob Goodall, had often told me stories about him. I also remember an old black and white photo of him with a very impressive beard and had often assumed Mr Beard was a nick-name - it wasn't.

I knew of Bill as a carpenter, cabinet maker and wheelwright and that he owned the wood-yard at the bottom of The Hillocks. What I didn't recall was that he was an instrument maker as well. If I had heard that, then I must have assumed that it was a hobby or I never made the connection that it was "musical" instruments.

So I phoned John Hartle (whose article Wilfried had found on Google) and Pat (his wife - my aunt and formally of this parish) confirmed that Bill had indeed been an instrument maker. I quickly replied to Wilfried to tell him the news: Will Beard of Kniveton, Derbyshire had, indeed, been an instrument maker and sent him a few internet links to local history pages that mentioned him.

Wilfried, replied saying the viola had been bought by him some years ago from a gentleman who had played it for many years at the world renowned Vienna State Opera.

If anybody can help Wilfried in his research about Will Beard - particulary about his instrument making - then I would love to hear from you. Contact details are the same as Kniveton News and I will gladly pass on any information on to Wilfired.

# Derbyshire Connect

Derbyshire Connect was launched in February to provide journeys between villages to the north, east and west of Ashbourne, up to and including the Wirksworth area. Derbyshire Connect is a bookable rather than turn up and go service.

Passengers need to book between one week and up to two hours in advance. This means that everyone's pick up and drop off points can be considered so routes and timings can be planned.

It is the first time a service of this kind has been run in Derbyshire.

The service runs six days a week. Between 7am to 6pm Monday to Friday and from 8am to 6pm on Saturday. There is no Sunday service.

Derbyshire Connect is for any kind of passenger, of any age and for any type of

journey. It can also be used to connect to conventional, timetabled bus

services for passengers wanting to travel further afield.

A leaflet with details of the buses operating area can be picked up from Ashbourne and Wirksworth Libraries, Ashbourne Leisure Centre, St Oswald's Hospital, Ashbourne and Ashbourne Medical Centre.

The bus is fully accessible for wheelchairs, plus it has room for bikes and buggies. Dogs can also be carried.

Journeys can be booked by email at bookings@derbyshireconnect.org.uk or by calling 01335 342951.

Fares are £3.80 adult return while Gold Card holders travel free after 9.30am weekdays and free anytime on Saturday. Group bookings can be made with fares chargeable at the appropriate individual rate.

Derbyshire Connect is currently being run as a trial for up to a year and if successful could be rolled out to other rural parts of the county.
