Kniveton Parish Council

The Parish Council met on 18th September 2018.

The Parish Council discussed the following agenda items:

Parish Council Vacancy - due to the resignation of Cllr Mary Elizabeth Howe a vacancy has arisen in the Office of Councillor for Kniveton Parish Council and we invite applicants to apply for co-option.

Interested persons must be a qualifying Commonwealth or EU citizen, aged 18 years or over and:

- Have lived in the Parish for the preceding twelve months
- Be a registered elector in the Parish: or
- Have occupied as owner or tenant any land or premises in the Parish for the preceding twelve months: or
- Have their principal or only place of work in the Parish for the preceding twelve months
- Must not be disqualified from holding office as a Councillor

A person is disqualified if they:

- Hold any paid office or employment to which they have been appointed by the Council
- Are the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order or interim order
- Have within five years of the day of co-option been convicted of any offence and has had passed on them a sentence of imprisonment for a period of not less than three months (whether suspended or not) without option of a fine
- Have been found guilty of corrupt or illegal practices or have been responsible for incurring unlawful expenditure and the court orders their disqualification

Applicants should note that Councillors are expected to attend monthly meetings and to represent the electors of Kniveton in

raising and discussing issues of interest on which the Parish Council is empowered to act.

Applicants will be invited to attend the next Parish Council meeting on Tuesday 13 November when a decision on appointment will be made.

Planters - The Council agreed to rent the planters to assess resident's reactions to them. Unfortunately, they were placed in the wrong locations which has caused some headaches and the contractors have been asked to re-place them. Let the council have your views on the planters.

New Reflectors - These have been ordered and we are awaiting information on positioning from Derbyshire County Council

Parking on Main Street - There are sometimes cars or vans parked partly on the pavement and partly on the road. If this causes you any problem when walking on the pavement, for example if you have a push chair, please can you report to the Parish Clerk, including the date and time, and if possible details of the relevant vehicle.

Footpath 7 - We want to monitor the condition of the public footpath called the jitty which runs from Main Street, up the steps and round the edge of a field, which eventually reaches the caravan site. If you find the surface of this path to be so muddy and/or

overgrown that you have difficulty walking along it, please can you report to the Parish Clerk, giving the location of the problem and the date on which, it was encountered.

Finance - Payments and balances were presented and approved.

New House Farm - Bob Smail submitted a letter to the Council outlining his commitment to ensure no further events would be held that had high noise levels and anti-social behaviour. He told the Council that the organisers of the May and June 2018 events had both been banned from holding future events. Laura Salmon outlined the process of approvals at DDDC. The Council will be notified of all future applications and inform residents, so your concerns can be raised. If you experience any noise nuisance at all, please 101

After the visit to the Minster a number of our group had a lovely lunch out in the sunshine at the Old Theatre Deli (we can recommend it if you're ever in Southwell).

We then went to the Workhouse to see what life was like in days gone by for poor souls who found themselves destitute. It was a grim existence but at least they had food in their bellies and somewhere to lay their heads after a hard days toil. It was a sobering visit but after the tour we sat outside the café there having a cup of tea and suddenly we were treated to a display from the Red Arrows in the sky above us, which finished off our day out perfectly.

At our September meeting our speaker was Gary Spendlove from Brettles of Belper. The company started in 1786 making hosiery and is still in production today. Gary started with Brettles straight from leaving school and told us many anecdotes about his working life. He and his wife brought along many examples of their products including nightwear.
